




## Dear Friends,

Afterward enjoying the evening with friends around the firepit, Kevin began experiencing pressure in his chest. He initially thought it might be indigestion.

When the pain did not subside, Kim rushed him to the nearby UM Shore Emergency Center at Queenstown, where the medical team immediately recognized the gravity of the situation. He was transported to the UM Shore Medical Center Cath Lab in Easton.

Thank goodness he was in the right place.

They cleared a full blockage in the interior wall of his heart. Within a couple of hours, he was awake in the Intensive Care Unit.
